Responsibilities: Coordinate all activities between MTC MOAA and designated JROTC units in the Middle Tennessee area. Maintain and update JROTC points of contact. Coordinate preparation and presentation of MOAA JROTC Leadership awards to designated JROTC cadets at supported high school units. Keep MOAA board apprised of the status of and any changes to JROTC support.

Functions:

- Contact each JROTC Senior Instructor at the beginning of Fall Semester, update any contact information, and ask about any specific support needs for the year.
- Provide unit contact information to the chapter Secretary for the chapter website.
- Coordinate with board on unit requests for support.
- Keep board updated on any changes to the units supported.
- Coordinate with other MOAA chapters in the area for any changes to the units supported and keep the board updated.
- Request that the chapter secretary order MOAA JROTC Leadership medals for each JROTC unit supported early in January of each year.
- Contact each JROTC Senior Instructor at the beginning of Spring Semester, update any contact information, and request expected dates for each unit's awards ceremony. Some units conduct Military Balls early in the semester and may or may not present awards at the Ball.
- When award ceremony or ball date determined, request from each JROTC Senior Instructor the name of the awardee.
- Prepare the official JROTC Leadership Award certificate for each unit's designated awardee. Be aware that these names can change so it is prudent to wait until about two weeks prior to the award ceremony or ball to prepare the certificate.
- Coordinate at least one chapter member to present the MOAA JROTC Leadership awards at each unit's awards ceremony or ball, as appropriate.
- Keep board updated on status of awards presented and any needs for additional support.
